
The CHILD & FAMILY



- A child (and their caregivers) who is identified as a candidate for foster care who can remain safely at home or in a kinship home and is at imminent risk of entering foster care
- A child in foster care who is pregnant or parenting
- A child whose adoption or guardianship arrangement is at risk of a disruption/dissolution and includes postreunification services



### PREVENTION SERVICES ACROSS THE CONTINUUM




SERVICE PLAN

The Candidate for Foster Care must have a written prevention plan which includes the following:

- Identify the prevention strategy so that the child came remain in the home, live temporarily with a kin caregiver until reunification can be safely achieved, or live permanently with a kin caregiver;
- List of services or programs to be provided to or on behalf of the child to ensure success of the prevention strategy

# Well Supported (1)

Improved outcomes must be based on the results of at least two studies with non-overlapping analytic samples

The studies carried out in a usual care or practice setting

Earned a rating of moderate or high on study design and execution

At least one of the studies must demonstrate a sustained favorable effect of at least 12 months beyond the end of treatment on at least one target outcome

# Supported (2)

Improved outcomes must be based on the results of at least one study carried out in a usual care or practice setting

Earned a rating of moderate or high on study design and execution

Demonstrates a sustained favorable effect of at least six months beyond the end of treatment on at least one target outcome

# Promising (3)

Improved outcomes must be based on the results of at least one study

Earned a rating of moderate or high on study design and execution

Demonstrates a favorable effect on at least one target outcome


