

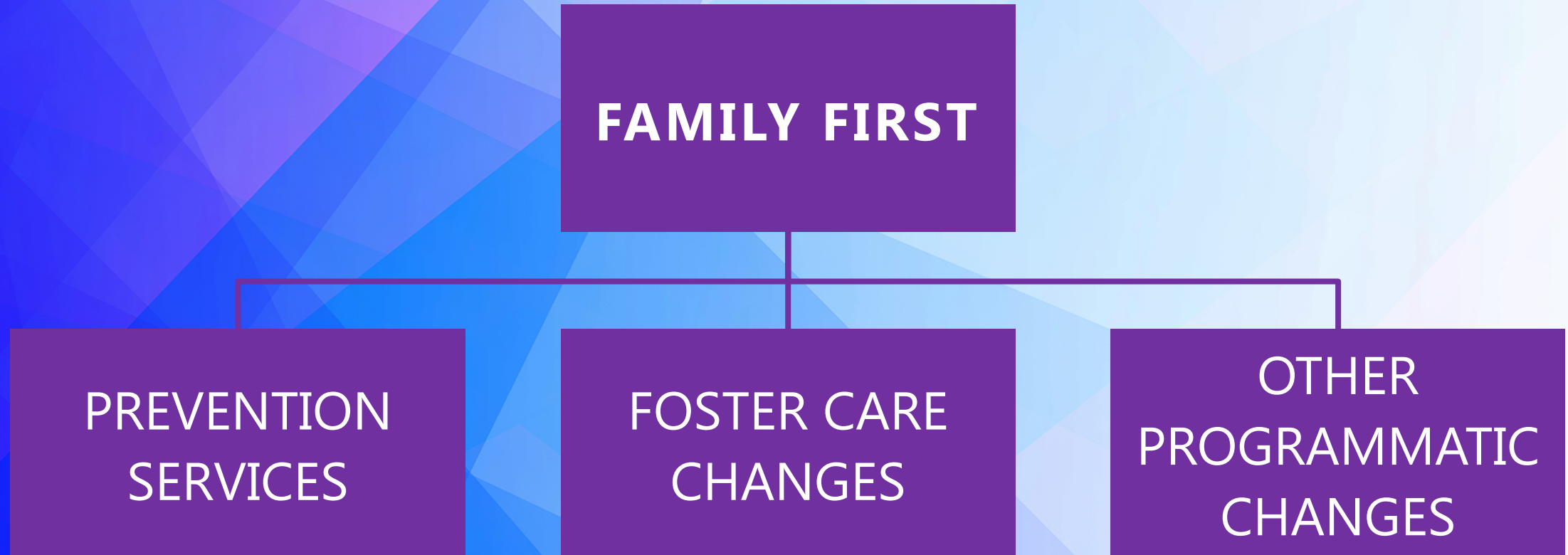


FAMILY FIRST PREVENTION SERVICES ACT

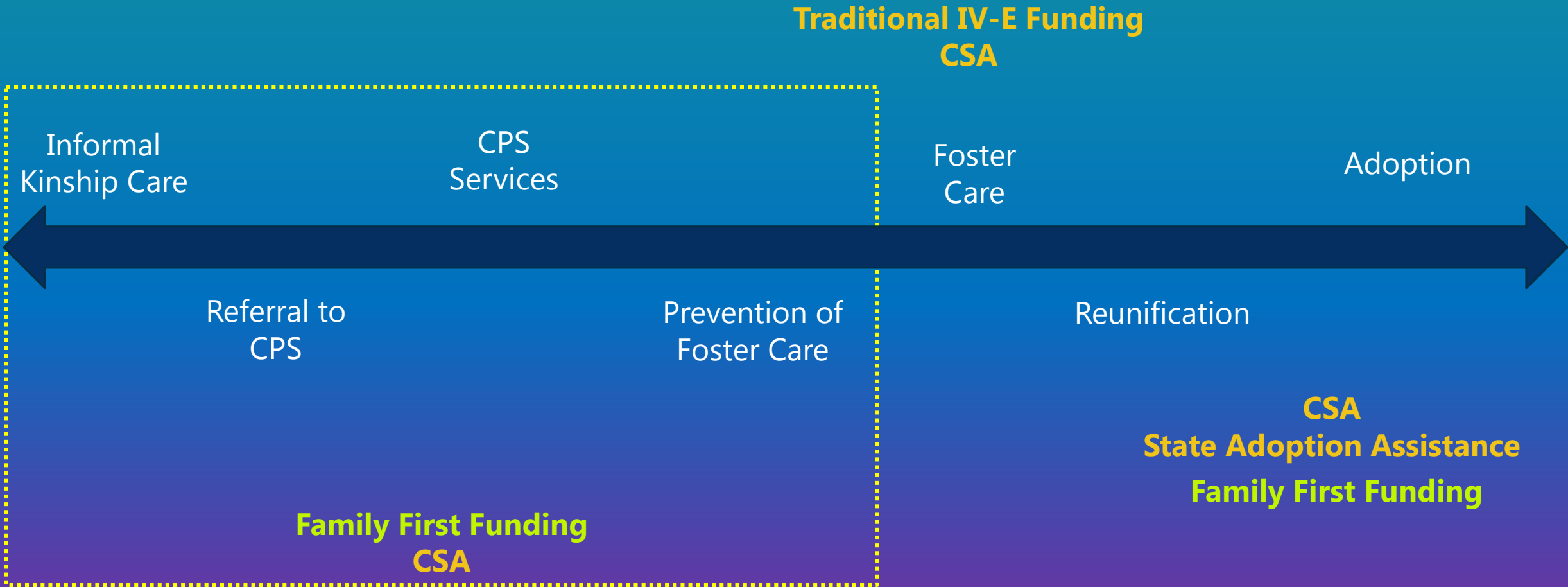

**WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR TITLE IV-E
PREVENTION SERVICES FUNDS?**

- A child (*and their caregivers*) who is identified as a candidate for foster care who can remain safely at home or in a kinship home and is at imminent risk of entering foster care
- A child in foster care who is pregnant or parenting
- A child whose adoption or guardianship arrangement is at risk of a disruption/dissolution and includes post-reunification services



PREVENTION SERVICES ACROSS THE CONTINUUM



The Candidate for Foster Care must have a written prevention plan which includes the following:

- Identify the prevention strategy so that the child can remain in the home, live temporarily with a kin caregiver until reunification can be safely achieved, or live permanently with a kin caregiver;
- List of services or programs to be provided to or on behalf of the child to ensure success of the prevention strategy

TITLE IV-E PREVENTION SERVICES CLEARINGHOUSE EVIDENCE-BASED DEFINITION

Well Supported (1)

Improved outcomes must be based on the results of at least two studies with non-overlapping analytic samples

The studies carried out in a usual care or practice setting

Earned a rating of moderate or high on study design and execution

At least one of the studies must demonstrate a sustained favorable effect of at least 12 months beyond the end of treatment on at least one target outcome

Supported (2)

Improved outcomes must be based on the results of at least one study carried out in a usual care or practice setting

Earned a rating of moderate or high on study design and execution

Demonstrates a sustained favorable effect of at least six months beyond the end of treatment on at least one target outcome

Promising (3)

Improved outcomes must be based on the results of at least one study

Earned a rating of moderate or high on study design and execution

Demonstrates a favorable effect on at least one target outcome

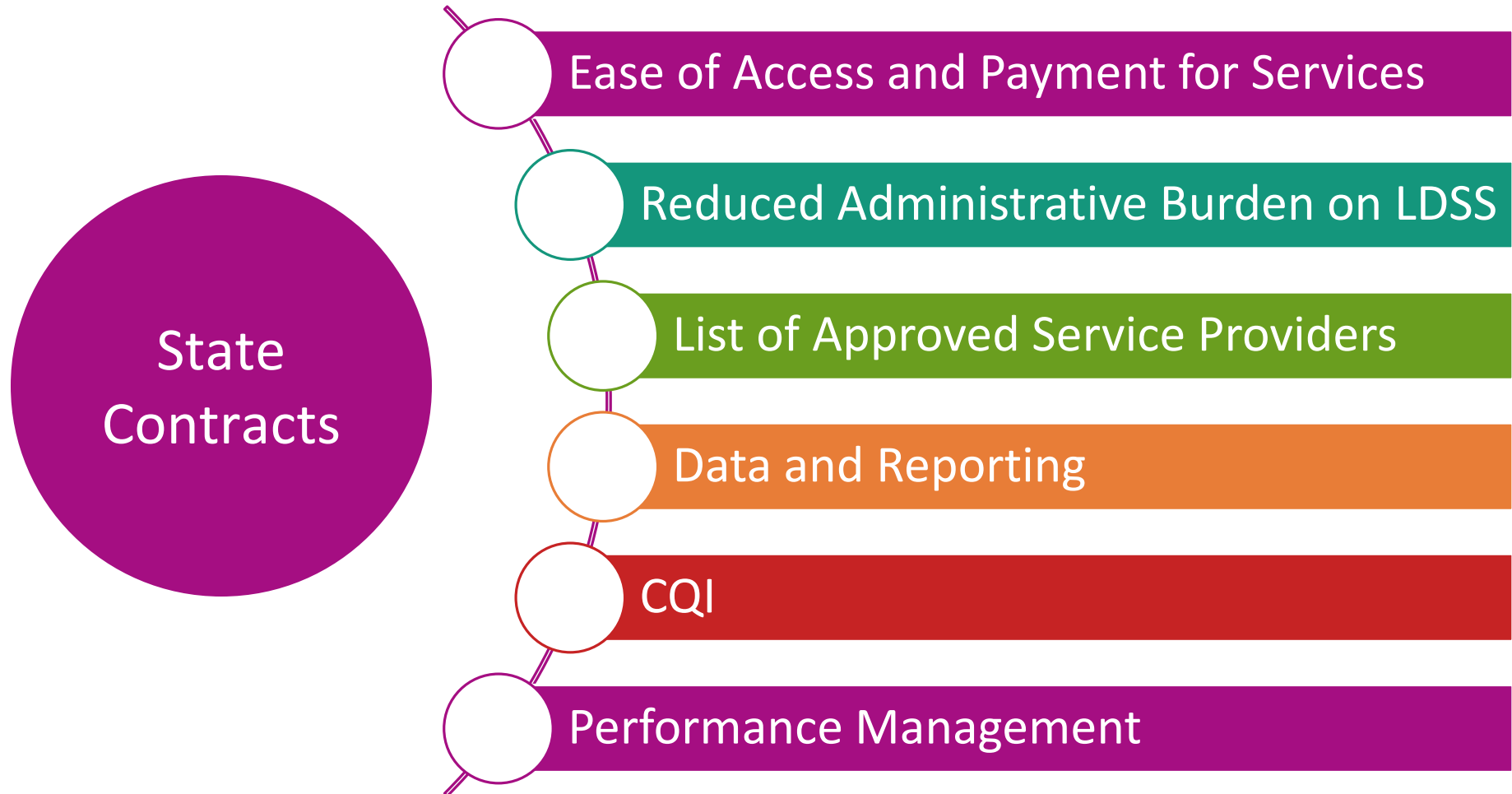
